RECENT PUBLIC-FACING POLICY WORK AND STUDENT ENGAGEMENT

2018 **Conceptualization and organization of first US-based Risk and Disaster Field School:** a 4-week ethnographic field school for undergraduates planned for summer 2019, located on the Texas Gulf Coast. Field School is collaboration between Browne's home institution, Colorado State University, and Texas A&M Corpus Christi where students will be housed. Browne will lead classes and immersion in original research projects to map risk perception using GIS and story maps. Morning classroom instruction will focus on accelerated learning of qualitative and quantitative research methods and social science approaches to the study of risk and disaster. Afternoons will be organized around fieldwork, interviewing, and mapping projects in surrounding coastal communities.

Leadership of this network has included conceptualizing collective approach, identifying types of activities that can best achieve mission, recruiting Advisory Board members, preparing materials to demonstrate members' expertise, working with sub-teams to present culture-based approach and consult with government and non-government entities in US and in international settings. - 2014** **Rapid re-design of spring 2014 disaster seminar following devastating floods of September 2013 in Northern Colorado.** In addition to course readings related to disaster studies literature, students participated in original, community-based research with Weld County's Long-Term Recovery Group (LTRG). The LTRG was assembled as a consortium of 15 NGO organizations in Northern Colorado tasked to provide recovery for communities impacted by the devastating floods of September 2013. Semester-long fieldwork research by 14 students included individual interviews, analysis, collaboration and collective analysis of findings, preparation of powerpoint and timeline mural for final student-led presentation to LTRG and community of Evans. The findings, insights, and recommendations drew a standing ovation by recovery professionals. April 22, 2014.

FIELDWORK RESEARCH:

- 2017-2019 Post-Harvey research with urban, rural, peri-urban residents in six counties of southeast Texas including Houston (3 coastal, 3 inland counties) to understand the factors that underlie their decisions to evacuate or not, relocate or not, rebuild or not, and how to restore life generally. My collaborator, Dr. Caela O'Connell, and I have made five trips to southeast Texas as of October 2018 to interview ranchers, farmers, coastal fishers, town dwellers and urban residents. Our methodology applies "assemblage" theory to decision-making research. We created a universe of more than 50 individual "tiles," each reflecting factors (learned through ethnographic work following disaster) related to social, economic, psychological, environmental, and bureaucratic factors that could impact a decision. Each interviewee assembles their own "assemblage" of tiles to indicate those factors that were at play in a given decision. The process draws out the interviewee's own stories, providing holistic data that can be distilled and compared across the sample. Such a context-rich, comparative approach to studying decision-making is rare. The point of this research is to consider how decisions in different types of communities, with different histories of vulnerability may shape longer term trajectories and well-being.

Created and maintained Facebook page for Tornado Survivors to share their stories of loss, grief, and anxiety as well as happy stories and joyful moments.

Conducted archival research at New Orleans Public Library, in-depth interviews with dozens of family members, and interviews with experts (historians, mental health practitioners, sociologists) and government officials. research project, grant proposal writing, and entirely new line of research and interviews.

- 2007-2009 Five-seven annual research trips and additional fieldwork each summer in New Orleans to collect updated data as process of recovery continued to unfold for families I am following. Interviews with church and community leaders, family members, scholars, and at archival centers.

The filmmaker and I began work on the *Still Waiting* documentary project in October 2005 and in 2006, made fieldtrips to New Orleans and to Dallas to continue filming the story of a large, African American extended family (155 members) who evacuated together to Dallas and began returning to New Orleans in January 2006. We completed filming for this project in October 2006, and then worked to transcribe the more than 100 hours of footage secured, and to code these interviews as a basis for creating the story line of the documentary. Final editing completed in May 2007. Broadcast on PBS stations in High Definition and Standard Definition began August 29, 2007.
- 2005 Development and management of new Katrina diaspora study. Conceptualization of new research program in wake of Katrina disaster based on my experience with Afro-Creole populations in the Caribbean. Work included rapid literature reviews (sociology of disasters, African American family structure and sense of community, etc.), locating collaborator at CSU (Lori Peek), organizing research opportunity with evacuee population in Denver for graduate student (Megan Underhill), writing NSF grant proposal with Lori, working through numerous formidable gatekeepers to gain entry into evacuee community at Lowry Air Force Base, organizing concrete research strategies for new collaborative team including filmmaker, interviewing evacuees for film project in Denver, Dallas, and New Orleans, managing administrative work (contracts, purchasing, reimbursements) associated with grant award.

- 2002 Located, contracted with, and managed work of native French and Spanish speakers to prepare transcriptions of 200 interviews in French and Spanish. Trained and supervised work of two students (one graduate, one undergraduate) to perform data coding work in a qualitative software analysis program, Atlas ti. Also worked with graduate Sociology student, Ross Smith, to prepare interviews and review data questions from 350 interviews in 3 languages for data entry into SPSS.
