COURSE COSTS: Registration Fee AND Field Fee

- **University Registration fee for a 4.0 credit course**
- **Additional Field School fee of \$1,000 covers:**
 - Roundtrip transportation between CSU Fort Collins & Greybull, Wyoming & field transportation
 - Individual Student Field Equipment (e.g., field notebook, hand lens, etc.)
 - Daily KOA meal fees (breakfast, lunch, dinner)

PARTICIPANT SELECTION:

Course enrollment is limited to a maximum of 10 students; priority is given to undergraduate applicants. Decisions about who will be included in the 2017 field course will be determined by (1) academic background and experience, (2) enthusiasm & interest in gaining paleo field experience, & (3) applicant interviews.

If all else is equal, priority will be given to those who apply *BEFORE* the deadline.

A wait-list will be maintained for qualified applicants who cannot be accommodated due to course enrollment size. Wait-listed students will be contacted if a space becomes available.
