Abstract: My thesis investigates common ideologies as manifested in the rhetoric of local musicians, musician employers and musician advocates. I used an autoethnographic method in which I triangulate interview data of local music culture participants, my own accounts of my experience as a local musician, and traditional secondary research in order to come closer to locating and describing the experience of local musicians and the ways that rhetoric and

ideology disempower or empower these individuals. I also suggest how community literacy may be used in order to advance the idea of occupational advocacy.
