The Religious Studies Interdisciplinary Minor encompasses the major religious traditions of humankind. It enables students to integrate a field of special interest from offerings in religious studies and related areas. Students can study religion as viewed by different disciplines, e.g., philosophy, history, psychology, sociology, and anthropology. In addition, the program encourages students to view religious phenomena in their cultural context through the media of music and the arts.

Program Requirements:

1. 21 credits in at least three disciplines are required: PHIL 171 Religions of the West, PHIL 172 Religions of the East, and at least two subject codes besides PHIL from the Additional Courses list.
2. A minimum grade point average of 2.000 is required in courses selected for the program.

Two required courses designed to survey the religions of the world,
and to introduce students to methods of studying and understanding religion.
