

JMC Student Success. By the Numbers.

What is the likelihood you will earn your CSU degree? How long will it take?

Below are the six-graduation rates for Journalism and Media Communication majors versus other students who entered CSU as freshmen or transfer students in Fall 2010 and earned their degrees by Fall 2016.

- JMC students earned degrees at higher rates than other CSU students.
- JMC students took less time to complete their studies than other students.

Data are based on the latest available graduation statistics calculated annually at the beginning of each Fall semester. New Freshman figure includes students who continued in JMC and some students who switched to another major. Average terms to graduation include every lapsed fall, spring and summer from enrollment through graduation, even if the student did not enroll during the term. Colorado State and other schools typically use six years as the timeframe for calculating graduation rates even though many students complete their studies in 4 or 5 years. These rates vary by year.
