THE CREATIVE TEAM

Garrett Ayers (Director) has worked for over a decade as a professional director, teacher, and acting coach and has trained or collaborated with some of the world's foremost theatre companies, including The Wooster Group, The Workcenter of Jerzy Grotowski & Thomas Richards, SITI, and others. In addition to his work as a freelance director, Garrett is the founder of HowToRemember.com, a company devoted to teaching actors how to train and improve their memories, and is also a Professor of Acting and Directing (Adjunct) at Colorado State University. Previous CSU productions credits: *Spring Awakening*, *The Complete Works of William Shakespeare (abridged)*. Garrett is an Associate Member of SDC, an alumnus of the 2009 Lincoln Center Theater Directors Lab, and was the Charles Evans Fellow (Directing) at the Tony Award-winning McCarter Theatre in Princeton, NJ for their 2010-11 Season. MFA, Naropa University.

Roger Hanna (Scenic Design) has designed sets for modern dance in Tokyo and a Yiddish musical in Tel Aviv. He designs plays, musicals, operas, and dance all over the country, in cities with such picturesque nicknames as The Air-Conditioned City, The Big Peach, City of Angels, The City of Brotherly Love, The Crown of the Blue Ridge, Magic City, Paradise, River City (both the one in California and the one in Tennessee), and Steel City. He has also designed over 150 productions in the City So Nice, They Named It Twice.

Before coming to CSU, Roger's academic experience included teaching at NYU, Rutgers, SUNY, and the University of Miami, and designing at University of Minnesota, The New School, Point Park, Ramapo, Temple, and Yale. Roger is a member of USA Local 829 and holds a BA in Theater (UCLA) and an MFA in Set & Lighting Design (NYU).

This summer Roger designed the set for the NYC premiere of the opera *Il Postino*, as well as sets and projections (co-design) off-Broadway of the acclaimed new translation of Jules Romain's *Donogoo*. Other recent projects include collaborations with Jonathan Bank, Joseph Colaneri, Nilo Cruz, Jackson Gay, Susan Marshall, Eleanor Reissa, and Tommy Tune.
