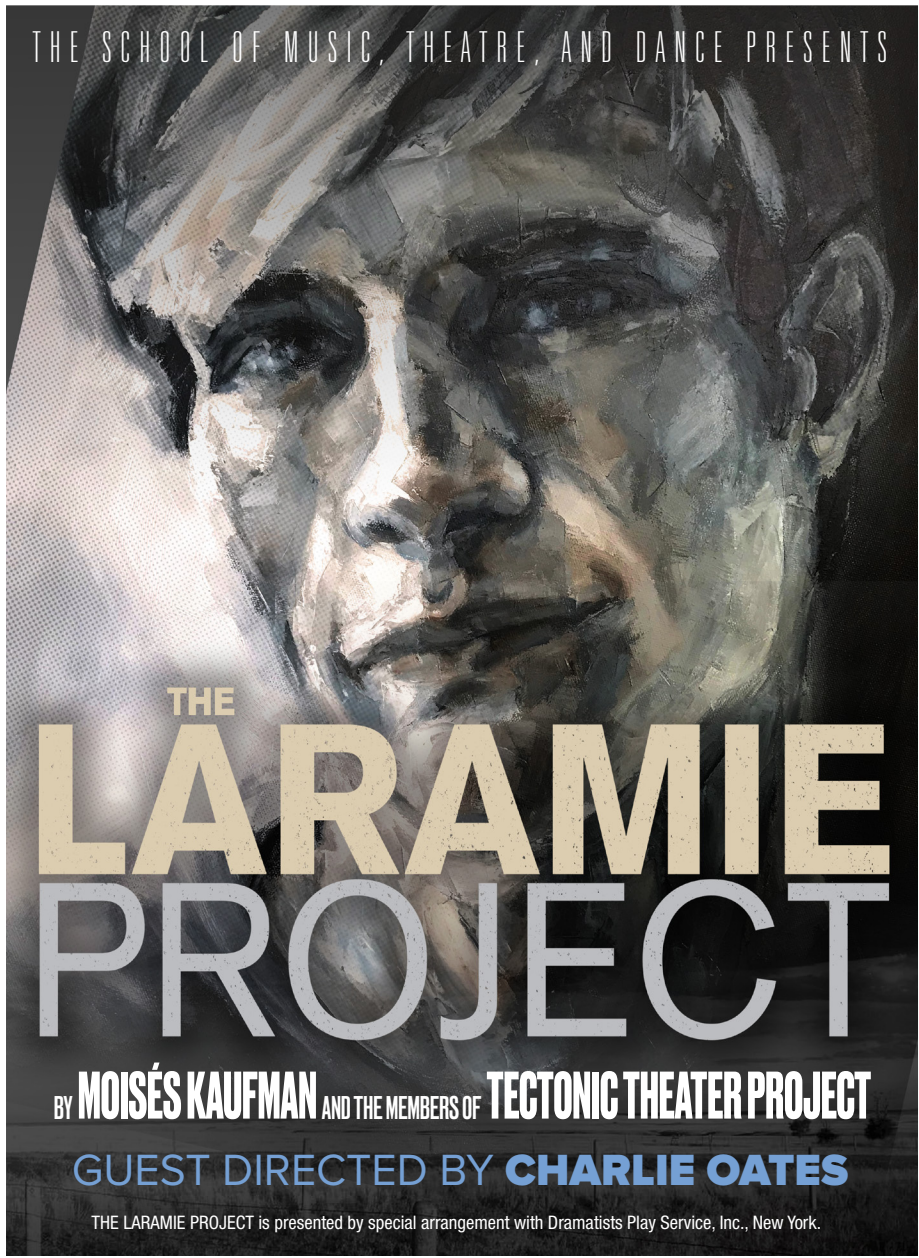

Last year more than 1,300 productions were entered in the KCACTF involving more than 200,000 students nationwide. By entering this production, our theater department is sharing in the KCACTF goals to recognize, reward, and celebrate the exemplary work produced in college and university theaters across the nation.

AUTHOR'S NOTE by Moisés Kaufman

The Laramie Project was written through a unique collaboration by Tectonic Theatre Project. During the year-and-a-half development of the play, members of the company and I traveled to Laramie six times to conduct interviews with the people of the town. We transcribed and edited the interviews, then conducted several workshops in which the members of the company presented material and acted as dramaturgs in the creation of the play.

As the volume of material grew with each additional trip to Laramie, a small writers' group from within the company began to work closely with me to further organize and edit the material, conduct additional research in Laramie, and collaborate on writing of the play. This group was led by Leigh Fondakowski as Head Writer, with Stephen Belber and Greg Pierotti as Associate Writers.

As we got closer to the play's first production in Denver, the actors, including Stephen Belber and Greg Pierotti, turned their focus to performance, while Leigh Fondakowski continued to work with me on drafts of the play, as did Stephen Wangh, who by then had joined us as an Associate Writer and "bench coach."

DIRECTOR'S NOTE by Charlie Oates

It has been 20 years since the murder of Matthew Shepard. The verbatim interviews, court transcripts, journal entries and media accounts that comprise *The Laramie Project* take us back to that awful event and remind us not only of the circumstances of the tragedy and its aftermath but of the raw nerve it exposed. What becomes clear is that it wasn't just a buried raw nerve way below the surface, but an existing ache evidenced by the lurking nervousness of the gay community in Laramie and the attitude of some citizens that the "gay lifestyle" was a threat to them.

Much has changed since then, and of course, much has not changed. We still have hate crimes. We still have seething anger that results in violence. We still have people who misunderstand the lives of others.

Fortunately, we still have people for whom love and decency are primary and those people are clearly celebrated in *The Laramie Project*. That these are real people, not simply imagined characters in a play is obviously part of the power of this piece.

In our contemporary era of division and acrimony *The Laramie Project* reminds that there is still work to do. The play shows that soul searching is a necessity and that when we search our souls, we inevitably recognize that finding common ground with people is far more productive than focusing on our differences.

CREATIVE TEAM

CHARLIE OATES (DIRECTOR): is a director, writer, performer, movement coach, fight choreographer and educator. His directing credits include, *Flush* at Theatre Alfred in Prague (and on tour in the U.S.), *Save You, Help Me* at RAW Temple in Berlin, numerous productions at Creede Repertory Theatre (Colorado), Chalk Rep (Los Angeles) and at universities and actor training programs. As a movement coach and fight choreographer his work has been seen at theaters including La Jolla Playhouse, Mixed Blood Theatre, The Old Globe, Cincinnati Playhouse, San Diego Rep, Chautauqua Theatre Company and the Denver Center Theatre Company. Among his many works as a writer and performer, *Truck Dog* (with James Donlon) toured the U.S., Canada, Europe and Mexico and *Staying Married* (with Moira Keefe) toured the U.S., Canada, Ireland and New Zealand. He spent most of his long teaching career at the University of California, San Diego where he focused on the physical training of actors, also serving as department chair and receiving the Academic Senate Distinguished Teaching Award in 2016. He has been a guest artist in leading actor training programs in the U.S., Australia, New Zealand, Ireland, Switzerland, Hong Kong, Senegal, Sweden, and China. Currently, he is working with Phamaly Theatre Company in Denver to create a new work that will open in January, 2019. He lives in Missoula, Montana where he teaches periodically at the University of Montana and lives with his wife, writer and performer, Moira Keefe.

MONTY DANIELS (SOUND DESIGN): is a junior Theatre and Journalism double major, specializing in sound design. She was the sound designer for last year's musical, *Urinetown*, and will be the sound designer for next semester's comedy, *One Man, Two Guv'nors*. *The Laramie Project* has been an amazing, heartbreaking story to be part of, and she can't wait to share it with you tonight.
