

INTERNSHIPS



How does academic credit apply to internships?

- Is an internship for credit required for your degree? — **No**
- What class credit do you receive for a qualified internship? — **LB 487**; can be used for Upper Division Arts/Humanities/Social Science or free elective
- How many hours must you work to earn internship credit? — **45 hours of work = 1 academic credit**
- What is the maximum number of credits you can receive for your internship? — **3 credits**
- Can your internship be paid? — **Yes**
- Are there any other restrictions or requirements? — **Sophomore level standing or higher; 2.0 min GPA; app due one week before semester**
